COURSE DESCRIPTION

Contracts are the means by which commercial parties can exploit market turbulence. They can lock a buyer into a lucrative deal in a plummeting market whilst the same buyer, to escape a bad bargain, can exploit any discrepancy amongst such contracts. International Trade and Shipping requires intricate interaction between a number of contracts that address the sale of goods, the shipment of those goods and the financial arrangements for the payment for those goods.

Other courses on this subject tackle each of these complex contracts individually. However, this can leave participants unprepared for the realities of international trade disputes, which often centre upon an allegation of discrepancy between a number of these four essential contracts, vis-à-vis one another. *International Trade and Shipping: Law and Practice* embraces commercial practice, where disputes often arise when the essential blocks of an international trade transaction are not drafted back to back.

The course is designed for professionals engaged in international trade and shipping, both importers and, particularly in Queensland, exporters, as well as those providing legal services, insurance and logistical support to the trade. It is suitable for professionals with a legal background who wish to develop more specific expertise in these areas, and those from a non-legal background seeking to gain advanced knowledge of the legal framework applicable to International Trade and Shipping.

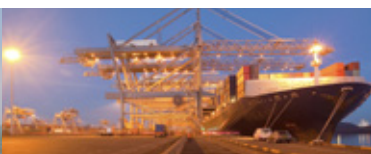

Mr Filippo Lorenzon

Since September 2009, Nick Gaskell has held the post of Professor of Maritime and Commercial Law at the TC Beirne School of Law at the University of Queensland in Australia. Prior to that, Professor Gaskell worked for 33 years at the University of Southampton holding positions as the Head of the School of Law (2003-2007), founding member and Director of the Institute of Maritime Law (1996-1999), and from 1994, as “David Jackson Professor of Maritime and Commercial Law.”
