Save the Date – MLAANZ 47th Annual Federal Conference

Brisbane October 13-14, 2022

The Australian and New Zealand branches of MLAANZ invite all members and those interested in maritime law to this year's 47th Annual Federal Conference – themed "Sustainability in Shipping".

The Brisbane conference will kickoff with a cocktail event at the wonderful University of Queensland Art Museum from 5.30pm to 7pm on Wednesday October 12. The conference sessions will then be held over two days at the Global Change Institute, University of Queensland (UQ), with a gala dinner on the Thursday evening at Customs House.

In line with the "Sustainability in Shipping" theme, the conference will showcase a range of presentations and speakers on topical issues including:

- United Nations treaties to combat plastic pollution in the ocean
- climate change litigation and class actions
- the impacts of marine casualties on the environment
- who foots the bill for the associated clean up – and the extent to which that liability can be limited



The Dethridge Memorial Address will be delivered by Emeritus Professor Nicholas Gaskell, UQ, and keynote speakers will include the Honourable Justice Sarah Derrington.
